Who we serve...

The *chronically homeless* often face barriers such as mental health, disabilities, substance abuse, and loss of supportive relationships. These barriers limit their access to assistance resources. Our ministry at Micah seeks to overcome such barriers by bringing the community together in a holistic approach to all of our neighbors' needs.

Mission...

Micah Ecumenical Ministries, a Christ-inspired community, is helping homeless people reach their greatest potential.

What we do...

Hospitality Center

A place for breakfast, showers, hygiene goods, clothing, sack lunches, a mailing address, and a warm sense of community.

Journey Program

An opportunity for Micah volunteers to connect in a meaningful relationship with guests as they help with resource assistance and navigating difficult systems.

Residential Recovery Home

Provides temporary shelter for homeless men and women who are leaving the hospital in need of temporary or terminal care.

Step Forward Employment Program

Provides employment services to disadvantaged individuals who suffer from multiple barriers to entering the mainstream work market.

Re-housing Program

A short-term assistance program for those with minimal barriers to housing stability. Participants receive case management and financial support in three-month increments, with intention to help as few months necessary for a person to fully transition.

Supportive Housing Program

A long-term assistance program for people experiencing chronic homelessness. Participants receive intensive wrap-around services and a rental subsidy, where they are required to pay no more than 30% of their total income.

Cold Night Shelter

An overnight facility that keeps street homeless from freezing to death during the winter months, November through the end of February.
